Ada Calhoun's instant New York Times bestseller Why We Can't Sleep: Women's New Midlife Crisis was one of the most anticipated books of the year for Vogue, the New York Times, Parade, O Magazine, Real Simple, and Book Riot, and is now out in paperback. A timely exploration of the new midlife crisis facing Gen X women, Why We Can't Sleep resonated with women across America and ignited conversations among friends, family, and coworkers that confirmed that it wasn't just them: many middle-class women across America were feeling overwhelmed, under-appreciated, and at odds with what they'd been told all their lives—that they could "have it all."

Ms. Calhoun spoke with women across America and looked into housing costs, HR trends, credit card debt averages, and divorce data. At every turn, she saw a pattern: sandwiched between the Boomers and the Millennials, Gen X women were facing new problems as they entered middle age, problems that were being largely overlooked. Instead of being heard, they were told instead to lean in, take "me-time," or make a chore chart to get their lives and homes in order. In *Why We Can't Sleep*, Ms. Calhoun opens up the cultural and political contexts of Gen X's predicament and offers solutions for how to pull oneself out of the abyss—and keep the next generation of women from falling in.

Ms. Calhoun is the author of the memoir *Wedding Toasts I'll Never Give* and the history *St. Marks Is Dead*. She has collaborated on several *New York Times* bestsellers, and written for the *New York Times, New York*, and *The New Republic*. She will be interviewed by **Deborah Siegel-Acevedo, Ph.D.**, adjunct faculty member in the College of Communication at DePaul University and a visiting scholar in Gender and Sexuality Studies at Northwestern University. Prof. Siegel-Acevedo is the author Sisterhood, Interrupted: From Radical Women to Grrls Gone Wild, co-editor of Only Child, a TEDx speaker, and founder of the new online course collective, Bold Voice Collaborative.
