Most marriage memoirs are a shiny, happy lie. In *Foreverland: On the Divine Tedium of Marriage*, popular advice columnist and essayist *Heather Havrilesky* (FAN '18) sets out to write the world's first brutally honest but still somehow optimistic inside look at how a marriage actually functions – and stumbles, and struggles, and sometimes fails – over the course of fifteen years. From falling madly in love with her handsome professor husband to the cold feet that ensued when she discovered some of his more jarring flaws, through the harrowing experiences of raising three kids, moving to the deeply uncool suburbs, becoming obsessed with a random, out-of-the-blue crush, and facing mortality in the middle of a pandemic, Havrilesky brings readers on a marital joyride in a clown car that sometimes swerves dangerously toward sheer cliffs. Or as she puts it, "To be married is to have the words 'This is all your fault' eternally poised on the tip of your tongue."

This gracefully written, insightful exploration of the joys and horrors of long-term commitment is the marriage memoir most of us didn't know we needed. One part cautionary tale, one part high comedy, two parts moving testament to the power of honesty, *Foreverland* offers a chaotic but oddly soothing allegory about accepting the scary twists of love without turning on your one and only. Whether you're single, dating, cohabiting, married, divorced, or anything in between, this emotionally satisfying memoir will reassure you that, when it comes to love, we're all in the same leaky boat.

Havrilesky writes the popular "Ask Polly" advice column on Substack and is the author of *What If This Were Enough?*, How to Be a Person in the World, and Disaster Preparedness. She has written for The New Yorker, The Atlantic, The New York Times Magazine, and NPR's All Things Considered, among others, and maintains the "Ask Molly" newsletter, written by Polly's evil twin.

Havrilesky will be in conversation with **Leslie Jamison** (FAN '19), the *New York Times* bestselling author of two essay collections—*The Empathy Exams* and *Make it Scream, Make it Burn*—as well as a critical memoir, *The Recovering,* and a novel, *The Gin Closet*. A graduate of Harvard College and the Iowa Writers' Workshop, Jamison also graduated with her Ph.D. from Yale University.
