Because most would-be rebels lack the strength and skills to overcome hostile audiences, principled insubordination remains an under-leveraged asset in the workplace and public square.

A Professor of Psychology at George Mason University, and a leading authority on well-being, curiosity, courage, and resilience, Prof. Kashdan has published over 200 scientific articles, and he received the American Psychological Association's Award for Distinguished Scientific Early Career Contributions to Psychology. His books *Curious?* and *The Upside of Your Dark Side* have been translated into over 15 languages. His writing has appeared in the *Harvard Business Review, National Geographic,* and other publications, and his research is featured regularly in media outlets such as *The New York Times, The Atlantic, Fast Company,* and *Time Magazine*.
